




At the demise of the husband or wife and in view of a mutual contract between us of this date duly signed and executed mutually signed and Executed by said husband and wife vesting the entire ownership of our Estates in the Survivor, we the said husband and wife by the said Survivor do hereby give and bequeath to each of our said Four Children an Equal portion of said Estate Share and Share alike, and in view of the long services of J. P. Underwood and of H. H. Diggs husband of Laura Diggs, it is hereby provided that the property hitherto deeded to each of said parties shall be considered in the final division as of the value of One thousand dollars to each, and no more, and in the final division Ella H.
