PASQUOTANK, October 27th, 1755.

Sir:—I bearin have inclosed the List of the whole Regiment Under My Command as Near To your Excell. orders as I could, and have since My arrival from the West Indies Taken a Great Care and Diligence to have them well Disciplin'd and to see that they be in Good order as I weell Could, and Ever shall be Carefull to Doe the same While I Continuè in that Station, &c.

Sir, also Rec'd yours of ye 22d of November, which I shall as Nearly Comply with as I Can, but have Had noe oportunity yet by Reason of My Going out of the Countrey Did Not qualifie to the Commission of the peace while sence my arrival, But now Shall Set about to put Matters in as Good form as Lies in My power, and shall Ever be ready to obey your Excell. Commands with the Greatest Care and industry My Weak Cappinessity will afford, so Conclud.

Pass, Sir, Your Humble and obediant Servent.

Andrew Pickens, private was b. 1732 in Bucks Co., Penn. & d. 1817 Pendleton Dist. S.C. Andrew Sr. was b. in Ireland, said to have been of the French Huguenots who had fled France. John Pickens was killed at "Battle of 96" in the Revolution in S. Carolina. Mr. M.H. Crockett living 1956 in Austin I believe descends from Robert Crockett. He claims to be closest living kin to Davie Crockett.

Captain Andrew Pickens, Sr., b. ?m. Anne ? , d. after 1758 in Anson County, N.C. His will was filed or probated that county 1757, and wife or widow Anne was then living. Andrew and John Pickens named in the Company were sons of Andrew Pickens, Sr. John was killed in the Revolution. Andrew became the General of the Revolution. Jane the daughter m. Rev. Robert Miller b. about 1730 in Scotland; taught school and was a Presbyterian minister at the Waxhaw Church near Lancaster, S.C. said to be the oldest Southern Presb. Church in the U.S. and deed was made to the Trustees for 4 acres of ground for it in 1758 by Rev. R. Miller and Jane Pickens his wife of record at Wadesboro, N.C. (Anson Co.) as it was then thought to be in N.C. but is actually in what is now S.C. This was the community that produced Davy Crockett's ancestors, Andrew Jackson, and many others of note. John Crockett "ensign" (Lieut. in this Company could have been Davie's father, John. Miss Nancy Crockett, Lancaster, S.C. is a descendant of the pre-Revolutionary clan of Crocketts and has much data on them. Many are buried in the Waxhaw Church Cemetery. I never knew of any kinship to the Crocketts, until about 1940 Frank Israel once wrote me, "I was always told

by my father that I was kin to Davie Crockett, but I do not know how it is".. A Mrs. E.K. Turner (now dead) later wrote to me that one of the Crockett girls m. a Pickens, but I never got around to tracing it, so can not give the straight of it. But it is probable that it is correct, for ANDREW PICKENS, Sr., and JOHN CROCKETT, signed as "witnesses" the deed to the 4 acres of land given by Rev. Robt. Miller and wife JEAN (Jane) Pickens for the church and cemetery 1758 at the Waxhaws. Actually, the Texas Crockett kin of Davie do not know much about their Davie's father-mother or grandparents...if anything at all.
